

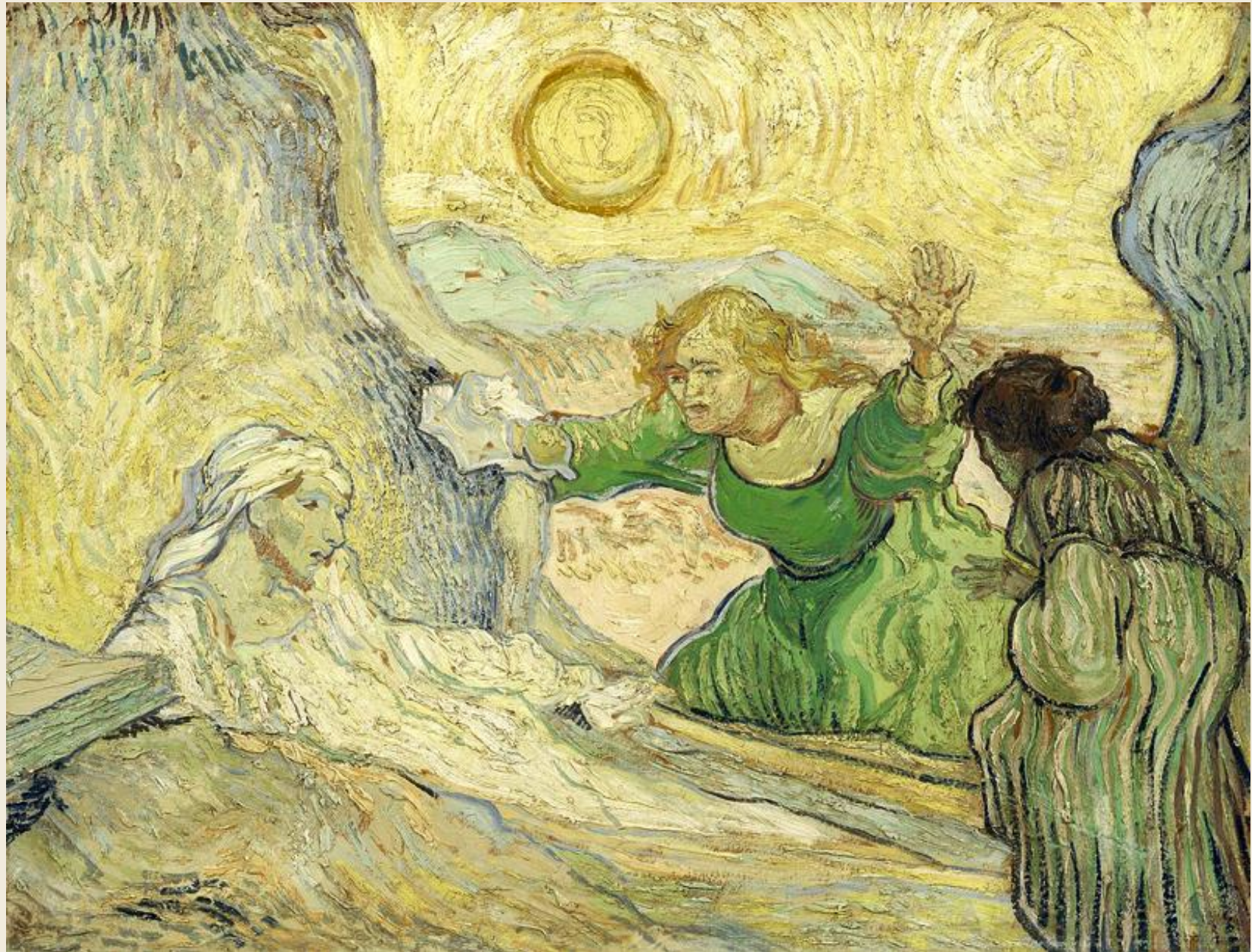

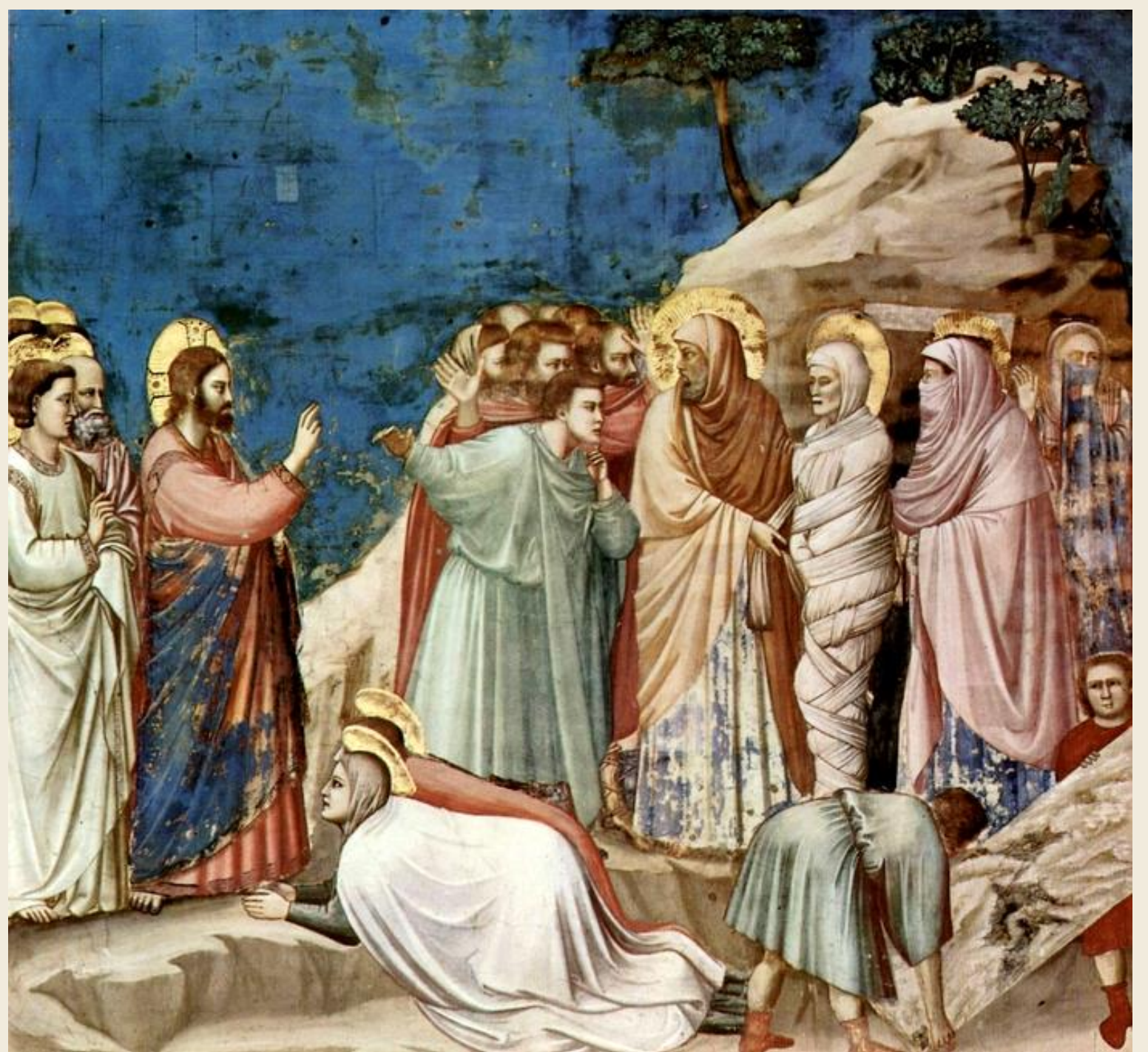

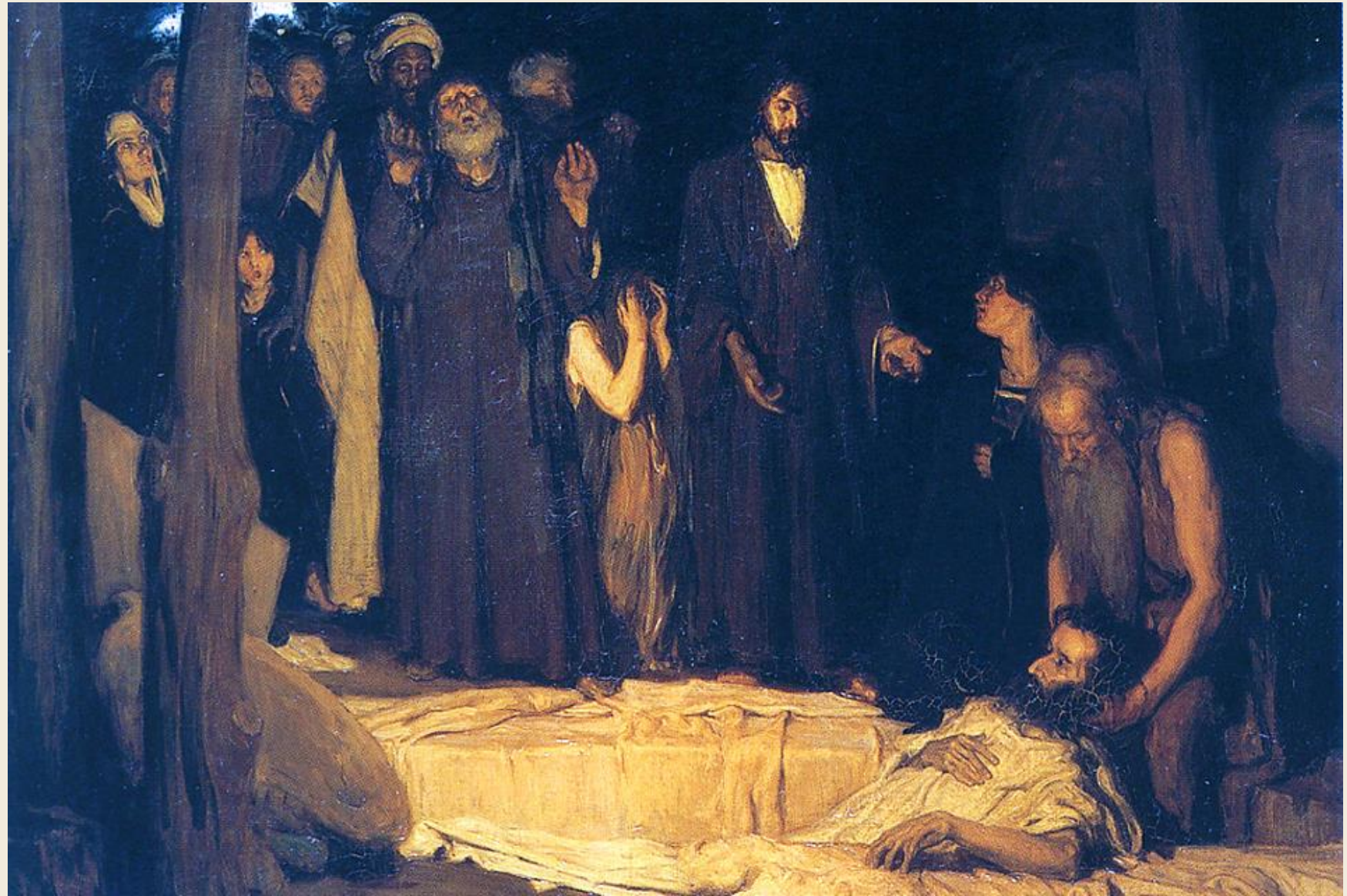

weary souls.*

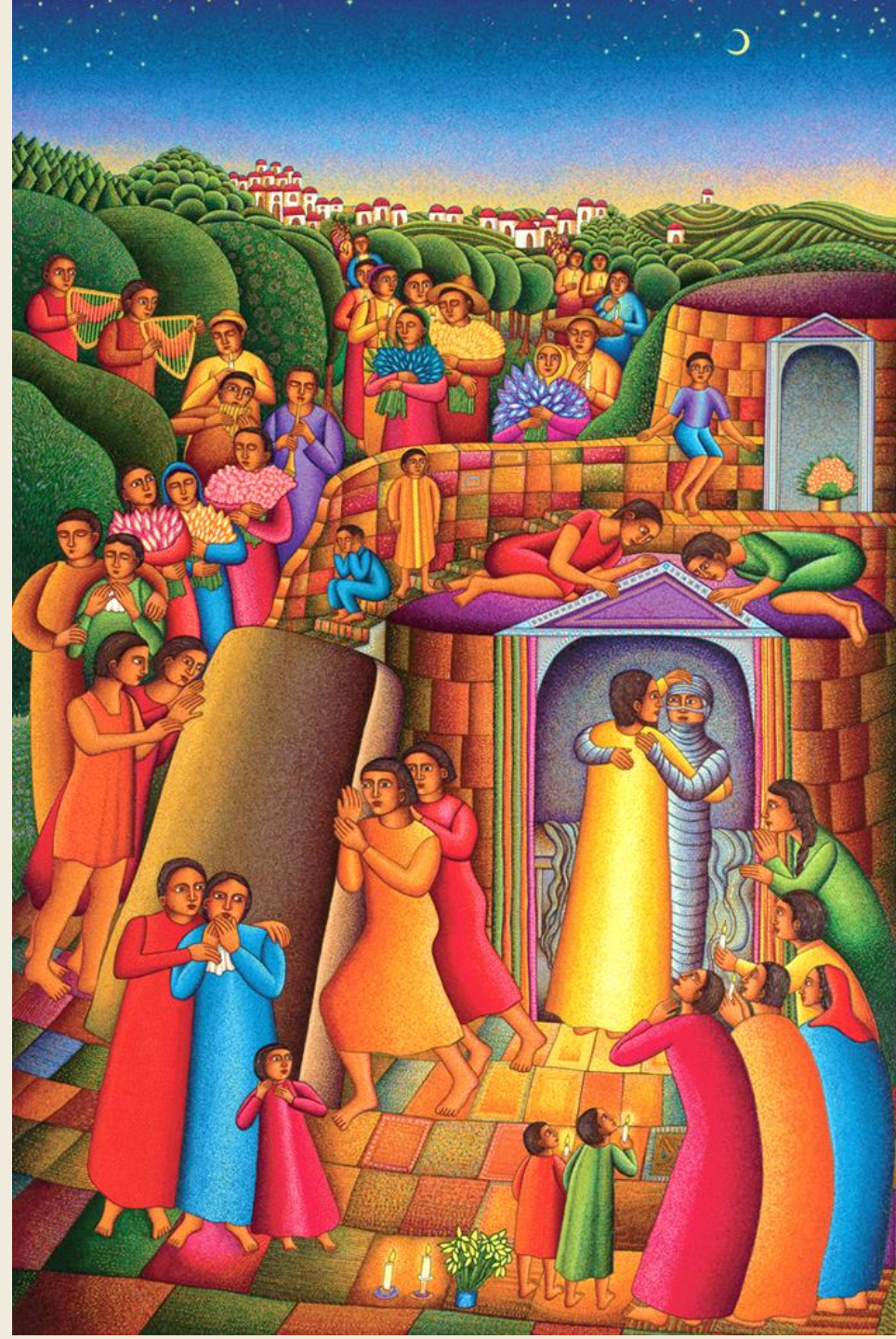
